

II Corinthians 6:10 -

"Having nothing, but possessing everything"

Hebrews 11:26 -

He considered the reproach of Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he was looking to the reward.

B. God Has His Purposes - Vs. 10

I Peter 1:5-7 -

By God's power (you) are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, so that the tested genuineness of your faith-more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

James 1:12 -

Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him.

D. Those Who Die Will Live Eternally - Vs. 10-11

Romans 8:16-18 -

The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him. For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us.
